IF THE O ISN'T STRESSED IT PRONOUNCES AS A.

As an example we will take an adjective in different forms.

XOPOLIO - good is the common example to see how this rule works. So first two Os aren't stressed and they are pronounced as A, the last one stays O, because it's stressed.

ХОРОШИЙ - masculine good the second O is stressed so it remains O, and the first one isn't, which makes it A in pronunciation.

Lets take another example – any word that ends with OFO, in this case **ДВЕНАДЦАТОГО – ON TWELFTH**, which is ordinal number.

So in this case OFO pronounces as ABA. It works with all ordinal numbers, which end on OFO.
