




## Introduction to Barre Chords: Lesson 4



This time we will use an A major chord as the basis for our barre chord. Doing this results in another shape we can move up and down the strings. Also it gives us yet another way to play every possible major chord chromatically! But this time they are rooted on the A string instead of the E string. The score and images below show the notation tab for the chords in the video.


**A Major Shaped Barre Chords**
