


Introduction to Barre Chords: Lesson 5

This time we will use an A minor chord as the basis for our barre chord. Doing this results in another shape we can move up and down the strings. Also it gives us a way to play every possible minor chord chromatically rooted on the A string! The score and images below show the notation tab for the chords in the video.



A Minor Shaped Barre Chords





Notes on the Low A string indicate Root note of A Shaped Barre Chords





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
