GRAMMAR

The Focus of This Lesson Is Existence with the Verb *Haber*. ;No hay internet!
"There's no Internet!"

The verb *haber* has two functions: one is to be the auxiliary verb we use for all the compound verb forms (e.g., "I **have** eaten," "We **had** spoken," etc.). The second function of *haber* is to express the existence of things, people, actions, and events (e.g., "**There is** a man."). In this lesson, we focus on the second function.

In the present indicative, *haber* has a special form for existence: *hay* ("there is," "there are"). Unlike the English "there is" and "there are," the Spanish *hay* is invariable with respect to number; that is, it's *hay* for both singular and plural.

Formation

In the present tense of the indicative mood, the verb *haber* has only one form:

hay ("there is," "there are")

This is a verb of existence. If we take the sentence *Hay nubes en el cielo* ("There are clouds in the sky"), we can substitute *hay* for *existen* ("exist") and we get "Clouds exist in the sky." Saying *hay* in this sense is a way of stating the existence of something, someone, some place, etc.

To say that something (or someone) does not exist, the negation adverb no ("not") directly precedes the conjugated verb hay.

Sample Sentences

- 1. Hay una botella de vino en la mesa."There is a bottle of wine on the table."
- 2. Hay mariscos en el saltado."There are shellfish in the stir-fry."
- 3. Hay carne en la sopa.
 "There is meat in the soup."

- 4. Hay bebidas para tomar."There are beverages to drink."
- Hay diez personas en el bus."There are ten people on the bus."
- 6. Hoy no hay tamales.
 "There are no tamales today."

CULTURAL INSIGHT

Chatting online in Spain

What AOL Instant Messenger is/was to the United States, MSN Instant Messenger is to the Spanish-speaking world. It's as simple as that. Why is that? Very simple: AOL was only accessible in the United States.
